Soccer Goal – Maintenance Guidelines

- Frequently inspect each soccer goal for structural integrity and check all welds and connections to make sure welds are not cracked and that all joints and connections are secure.
- Replace any damaged or missing parts immediately. Contact Keeper Goals for help in replacing parts.
- Frequently inspect goals for nicks and scratches in the paint that could result in rust and inspect goals for any rust that may have occurred. Rust is not a condition of the warranty. The best rust protection is early detection. If needed, sand and re-paint.
- Goal frame must be anchored at all times and shall be secured against overturning.
- Frequently check to make sure warning and safety labels have not been removed or damaged. All warning and safety labels attached to the soccer goals must be visible at all times. If replacement labels are needed, please call Keeper Goals for FREE replacement labels.
- During the off-season or when the soccer goals are not in use, the soccer goals shall be disassembled and stored in a safe, secure location.
- When soccer nets are in storage, protect the soccer nets from direct sunlight /harsh weather conditions and store the soccer nets in a location/container where small animals and rodents will not be able to get to them.
- Over time you may wish to have your soccer goals sandblasted and re-finished to further extend the life of your goals. Contact Keeper Goals for more information on re-finishing soccer goals.
- The net attachment snap hooks may break over the lifetime of the soccer goal. Replace any net attachment snap hooks with Keeper Goals #HR-1 replacement hooks (Option 1) or re-cable the goal with Keeper Goals #HO-2 enclosed snap hooks (Option 2). Due to safety considerations, do not replace broken snap hooks on the crossbar and on the upright portion of the side panels with metal clips.
